The primary delays are related to power outages and impediments such as downed power lines and trees. While telecom crews work diligently to restore power, our fuel distributor members and retail convenience store members are working equally hard to ensure that fuel is available to Texans in the affected areas.

To be very clear, there is no shortage of fuel. The issue is simply logistics, combined with long wait times at most fuel terminals in the area. TFFA will continue to work alongside the Texas Department of Emergency Management to ensure that fuel continues to be delivered as safely as possible.
